



You have Reword Me. Here is how to use it.

Fix awkward texts before you send them, without leaving Messages.

Read this part first. It saves everyone a phone call.

Reword Me does **not** put an icon on your home screen. Nothing went wrong with your download. It is a Messages app, which means it lives **inside the Messages app**, in the row of small apps next to where you type. If you have been hunting your home screen for an icon, stop. It is not there, and it is not supposed to be.

1. Find it, the first time

- 1 Open **Messages**, the green app you already text from.
- 2 Open **any conversation**. Pick one, or text yourself. You will not send anything by accident.
- 3 Tap the **+** button just to the left of where you type your message.
- 4 Tap **More** if you do not see Reword Me right away.
- 5 Tap **Reword Me**. A small panel opens over the keyboard. That panel is the app.

On older iPhones there is no **+** button. Instead there is a row of tiny app icons underneath the text box. Swipe sideways along that row until you see Reword Me.

If Reword Me is not in the list at all

It is installed but switched off inside Messages. Turn it on:

- 1 In a conversation, tap **+**, then **More**.
- 2 Tap **Edit** in the top corner.
- 3 Find Reword Me in the list and switch it **on**.
- 4 Drag it to the top so it is the first thing you see next time.

2. Rewrite your first message

- 1 With the Reword Me panel open, tap the box labelled **Text to rewrite**.
 - 2 Type or paste your message. Write it badly on purpose. Blunt, rambling, whatever you would normally delete and start over.
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- 3 Tap the **Reword Me** button.
- 4 Read what comes back. If you like it, it drops into your message box.
- 5 Change any word you want, then tap send yourself.

It never sends anything on its own. You always press send. You can always edit the rewrite first, or throw it away and use your own words.

A good first test

Paste something you would actually hesitate over. For example: "*need that paperwork today*". Look at what comes back. If it is not better than what you wrote, that is worth telling us.

3. What it can and cannot see

It sees	It never sees
Only the words you type into its own Text to rewrite box.	Your conversations. It cannot read your messages.
That text goes out to be rewritten, then comes back. We do not store it.	Your contacts, your photos, or anything you did not type into it.
Nothing else. It has no access to the rest of your phone.	Your card details. Apple handles all payment.

4. How many rewrites you get

- **Free:** 3 rewrites a day. No account, no sign up. The count resets the next day.
- When you run out you will see a message saying **Daily limit reached**. That is not an error. It means today's free rewrites are used up.
- **Reword Me Premium:** 100 rewrites a day and no adverts. In the United States it is \$1.49 a month. The App Store sets prices per country, so your price is shown to you before you agree to anything.
- Cancel any time: **Settings**, tap your name, then **Subscriptions**.
- New phone, or reinstalled? Tap **Restore Purchases** in the subscription screen.

5. If something goes wrong

I cannot find it anywhere.

See section 1. There is no home screen icon. It is inside Messages.

A box popped up saying "Text Processor".

That is Reword Me. "Text Processor" is an old internal name still showing on error messages in the current version, and it is being replaced. Read the sentence underneath it, which is the part that matters. It is usually either no internet connection or a message that is too long.

It says my text is too long.

There is a limit on a single rewrite. Split a long message into two shorter ones and rewrite each.

The rewrite changed what I meant.

Edit it before sending, or discard it. It is a suggestion, never a decision. If it changed something important, send us the before and after.

I paid but I am still limited to 3 a day.

Open the subscription screen and tap **Restore Purchases**. If that does not fix it, email us with the Apple ID you paid with.

I would rather just talk to a person.

Completely reasonable. Email the address below and say you would like a call. Tell us what iPhone you have and what you tried.
